The Voice of America Bethany Relay Station was constructed in West Chester because of radio pioneer and engineer, Powel Crosley Jr. Born in Cincinnati, Powel Crosley Jr. was an American inventor, industrialist, and entrepreneur. We will have a docent led tour to explore the important work in broadcasting that was done right here in Cincinnati. After our tour we will have a picnic lunch at the Voice of America Park and explore the USS Cincinnati Memorial-Peace Pavilion. **The cost of the Trip and Lunch is \$15/person due to Life Enrichment by Friday, June 19th.**

Book Discussion Group will meet in the Lee Library to discuss *My Friends* by Fredrik Backman. Summary: Most people don't even notice them--three tiny figures sitting at the end of a long pier in the corner of one of the most famous paintings in the world. Most people think it's just a depiction of the sea. But Louisa, an artist herself, knows otherwise and she is determined to find out the story of these three enigmatic figures. Twenty-five years earlier, in a distant town, a group of teenagers find refuge from their difficult home lives by spending their days laughing and telling stories out on a pier. There's Joar, who never backs down from a fight; quiet and bookish Ted who is mourning his father; Ali, the daughter of a man who never stays in one place for long; and finally, there's the artist, a boy who hoards sleeping pills and shuns attention, but who possesses an extraordinary gift that might be his ticket to a better life. These four lost souls find in each other a reason to get up each morning, a reason to dream. Out of that summer

emerges a transcendent work of art, a painting that will unexpectedly be put into eighteen-year-old Louisa's care. As she struggles to decide what to do with this bequest, she embarks on a surprise-filled cross-country journey to learn the story of how the painting came to be. The closer she gets to the painting's birthplace, the more she feels compelled to unleash her own artistic spirit, but happy endings don't always take the form we expect in this fresh testament to the transformative power of friendship and art."
